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

- A. Moina wanted to go overseas to volunteer as a canteen worker, she was told she was too old to go overseas to volunteer.
- B. Moina decided to volunteer in the basement of a Columbia University Building in New York City. The work area was dark and dreary looking so Moina purchased flowers with her own money to brighten up the space. She met with the troops when they came in and tried to be like a mother or sister to the troops. Helping them if they needed it, or just talking to them about home.




