Engage: Hook the students	Activity – Hand out the Memorial Day K-W-L Worksheet. Give the students a few minutes to fill in the first section- "What I Know". Play the History of Memorial Day Video, <u>https://youtu.be/YChfpVD5xpk</u> Students will complete the K-W-L Worksheet.		
Explore: Students make sense of a concept through observations.	 Play the Read Aloud book, <i>America's White Table</i>, author, Margot Theis Raven, Illustrator Mike Benny https://youtu.be/uePSkyqYesE Answer the following Reflection Questions from <i>America's White Table</i> video: Why did the family set up this small white table? What effect did it have on their Uncle John? How do you think setting the white table would affect Veterans that we know today? What is a hero to you? Explain to students that families who have a loved one who has died while they are on active duty in the military are called Gold Star Families. 		
Explain: Teacher introduces formal vocabulary and language to students. Elaborate: Students apply what they have learned.
